



Dr. Jonathan J. Bonk is executive director of the Overseas Ministries Study Center in New Haven, Connecticut, and editor of the *International Bulletin of Missionary Research*.

Before his relocation to the United States in 1997, he served as Professor of Global Christian Studies at Providence College and Seminary in Canada. He was raised in Ethiopia, where he and his wife also served as missionaries, 1974–76.

He is an ordained Mennonite minister, has served as president of both the American Society of Missiology and the Association of Professors of Mission, and is currently vice-president of the International Association for Mission Studies.

He is the author of numerous articles and reviews and has published five books, the best known of which is *Missions and Money: Affluence as a Western Missionary Problem* (Orbis, 1991), now in its eleventh printing. A second edition is being prepared. As project director for the *Dictionary of African Christian Biography*, a multilingual (English, French, Portuguese, Swahili, Arabic), electronic, non-proprietary reference tool, he travels extensively each year in Africa.

He also serves as editor of the *Encyclopedia of Missions and Missionaries*, to be published in 2007 as Volume 9 in Routledge's *Religion and Society* Series.
